

TERIS

TERIS is a computerized database designed to assist physicians or other healthcare professionals in assessing the risks of possible teratogenic exposures in pregnant women. The database consists of a series of agent summaries, each of which is based on a thorough review of published clinical and experimental literature. Summaries may be accessed using either generic names or domestic or foreign proprietary names. Each summary includes a risk assessment derived by consensus of an Advisory Board comprising nationally-recognized authorities in clinical teratology.

Evaluation License - For Registrants with Invitation Codes or Registered NSGC Members

This license allows registrants with valid invitation codes or registered members of the National Society of Genetic Counselors (NSGC) free trial access to the TERIS database for 15 days. An attestation to each individual's eligibility along with an invitation code, if applicable, is required.

Academic License - For Medical Students and Residents

This license allows medical students and residents who are affiliated with a U.S. or Canadian institution free access to the TERIS database. An attestation is required that all Authorized Users are either medical students or residents, along with which program each person is in, the institution they're affiliated with, and the year they anticipate completing their program.

Medical students and residents must submit the license request. Additionally, they must include contact information for the person authorized to enter into the agreement on behalf of the organization (the Authorized Representative). Students and residents are encouraged to ask their supervisor, administrator or professor who the Authorized Representative should be for the organization.
